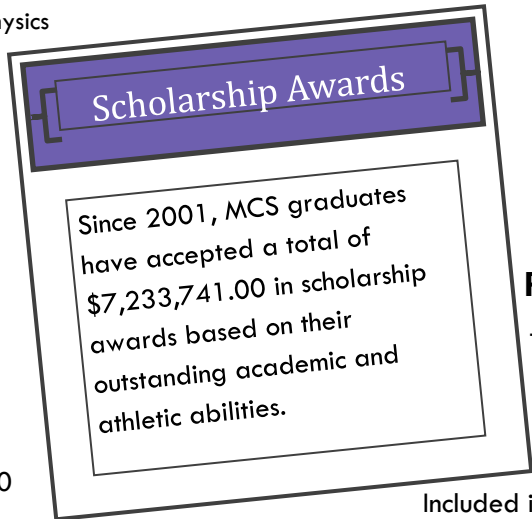

Portrait of an MCS Graduate

The 20 students of the class of 2017 were offered over \$1,793,000 in scholarships. They applied and were accepted to over 30 different post-secondary institutions.

Included in the class were 2 highly honored academic scholarship recipients, 1 DAR Good Citizen award recipient, and 1 collegiate-bound athlete. The class volunteered over 70 hours individually and over 1500 hours collectively at a variety of different ministries, agencies, and/or non-profit organizations. Nine of the 20 graduates maintained above a 4.0 GPA throughout their high school career, the cumulative class average ACT score was 23.7, and the cumulative class GPA was a 3.95.
