➤How do I fill out the Curriculum Worksheet?

On the reverse side of this page is an example. This is not a recommendation or endorsement of the said curricula, but an example of some of the varied approaches our MCS families use. Please note that grades must be recorded as a percentage unless it is a dual credit course. It is not necessary to include detailed descriptions of standard texts for our purposes, however, the curriculum worksheet is your student's permanent record of coursework and your opportunity to fully outline all of their hard work. Attaching a printout from the curriculum publisher's webpage is the easiest way to record all the information.

➤How do I record percentage complete and hours engaged?

For all courses, it is important to list the percentage of the text or curriculum completed in the semester being reported. This should be recorded as 50% at the end of the first semester if you are halfway through a one credit course. The second semester of a one credit course should also be recorded as 50% (second half of course). If you are using a non-standard curriculum, you must list the number of hours spent. One credit equals the completion of a high school level text (or higher) or a minimum of 130 hours of study if a specific text is not used.

➤What if my student is behind schedule?

You must turn in your attendance and curriculum worksheet without exception. Otherwise, it would raise questions of truancy. However, you may list a course as "Incomplete." For example:

Report the grade and credit on a separate Curriculum Worksheet after a half credit is earned or the course is completed. The credit is placed on the transcript in the semester it is completed.

➤How do I know if a course is acceptable?

Be certain your text is a high school level course and completely covers the required scope of the course. For typical textbooks (ABeka, BJU, etc.), there is a grade level listed; for other curriculum there is a grade range. For example, Apologia Physical Science is listed for 8th or 9th grade, so it can be used in 9th grade for high school credit but not beyond. For Sonlight, the cores listed in the hundreds instead of by letter are the high school level courses. For My Father's World, the offerings listed in the Declare section are high school level. For Easy Peasy courses, they must be from the high school site, not the elementary through 8th grade site. Another example: ABeka places World History in 10th grade and U.S. History in 11th grade. However, you could use these texts in any grade of high school. As always, do not hesitate to call or email us if you have a question about the acceptance of a particular course or curriculum. This is especially important when using a co-op class that does not use a standard text or when you design the course.

➤Any special considerations for co-op classes?

Yes; choose wisely and communicate with the instructor. Don't assume the co-op class will meet the course requirements. Ask for a syllabus. If it falls short in an area, you can supplement. Just remember, it is ultimately your responsibility. Discuss how grades are determined and/or ask for a grade sheet each semester. MCS does not need a copy of the grade sheet.

➤What isn't recorded on the transcript?

Your student's transcript is for academic coursework. There are many wonderful experiences your student will pursue during high school which aren't recorded on his transcript. These include extra-curricular activities such as community service, driver's education, and more than one PE or fine arts credit (unless there are special circumstances). It is wise for your student to prepare a resume and a keep a full accounting of his community service with the applicable signatures.
